[Abolition of Tolls \(Scotland\) Bill \(Ex\)](#)

This Bill seeks to make provisions for the removal of the remaining tolls from the Forth and Tay Road Bridges as soon as is practicable. This will be done by removing the powers of the Forth Estuary Transport Authority to charge tolls on the Forth Road Bridge and by removing the penalties for non-payment of these tolls. The powers of the Tay Road Bridge Joint Board to charge tolls on the Tay Road Bridge will be removed and relevant provisions relating to these powers will be repealed.

Current status

The Bill was introduced on 3 September 2007. The Transport, Infrastructure and Climate Change Committee was assigned as the Lead Committee for examination of the Bill. The Committee has issued a call for evidence with a deadline for receipt of written submissions on 5 October 2007.

The Committee met on 25 September 2007 and took further oral evidence on the general principles of the Bill at Stage 1. Details of the evidence, from two panels of witnesses, can be found in the [Official Report](#) of the Committee's proceedings. The Committee will meet on 2 October 2007 to take further oral evidence.
